## Update: December 2020 – January 2021 Restrictions Business Fund closing 5 February 2021

The December 2020 – January 2021 Restrictions Business Fund, administered by Gwynedd Council, closes at 12:00pm, Friday 5 February 2021. Support is available to businesses required to close or have suffered a reduction of 40% or more in turnover as a direct result of the restrictions. Businesses who are yet to apply for/receive support for the December 2020 and January 2021 period, can do so by completing a simple form. For more information and to apply, go to:

# Restrictions Business Fund Extension 25 January – March 2021

Further support for non-essential retail, hospitality, leisure and tourism and other businesses forced or required to close or significantly impacted by the ongoing restrictions has been announced:

Businesses liable for Non-domestic Rates who have already received funds for the December 2020 and January 2021 period will receive the additional

support during February without the need to present another application (eligible businesses who have not previously received support will still be able to apply by completing a simple application form).

Small businesses who don't pay Non-domestic Rates, and have lost a large part of their income, will also be able to able to access additional support by completing a simple application form. The application form for the new funding will be available during the week commencing 8 February 2021.
