COVID-19: Coronavirus control plan: autumn and winter 2021 update

Covid Stable is thought to be the most likely scenario with Wales remaining at Alert Level 0 through the autumn and winter, with all businesses able to open.

COVID-19: COVID Pass for events and nightclubs

From Monday 11 October 2021, people will be required to show the NHS COVID pass to demonstrate they are either fully vaccinated, or have had a recent negative Lateral Flow Test, to enter nightclubs and larger events.
